ANNUAL POLAR BEAR RUN LIVES UP TO ITS "CHILLY" REPUTATION

Pebble Beach Sports Car Club kicked off its 2023 events calendar with the Annual Polar Bear Run on Saturday, March 4, 2023. The 'brisk' drive was led by **Markus Woehler**, immediate past president and longtime member of the PBSCC.

About 40 club members, all appropriately bundled up, participated in the drive which included an enchilada and taco lunch buffet at Doña Esther's Mexican Restaurant in San Juan Bautista at the end of the drive. The chilly, damp event was represented by 24 cars.

Why is it called The Polar Bear Run? Because it always happens in winter when it's cold, and sometimes even wet. If that's not bad enough there are also 'loosely strict' rules that all participants must follow during this drive:

-All cars must have their top down if they are a convertible.-If you must drive a hard top car, all windows must be down.-Either way, no car heaters are to be used.

The drive started with a meeting of all drivers at Vince Dimaggio Park on Del Monte Blvd. in Marina where **Markus** handed driving directions to the very bundled up group of drivers. Passionate Car Enthusiast Gill Campbell Gives Talk on

Women In Motorsports of North America

Attending members of our March membership meeting had the privilege of hearing an interesting talk from **Gill Campbell**, a marketing professional focusing on building auto related events as well as a member of the executive committee of Women in Motorsports of North America, a national non-profit organization dedicated to promoting women and their passion in various aspects of the car world.

The automobile industry has been in **Gill Campbell's** blood her whole life. Growing up in England her father owned a Morris Minor Dealership that was considered the family business. After Gill's father moved the family to the U.S. in the mid 1970's Gill eventually went into the restaurant business as a bar manager. Around the 1980's Gill eventually worked her way into event marketing and management and started working around racetracks.

"It was like my DNA came bursting out," said Gill, "I knew then that I wanted to spend my life around cars and racetracks."

Kathy Hayworth, wife to board member, Mike Hayworth, was managing Laguna Seca and was looking for a replacement for herself. In 2001, Kathy connected with Gill and brought her on to manage Laguna Seca, only for a short-term contract. That short term contract lasted 17 years. And it is due to Gill's leadership and ingenuity that she was able to secure a multi-million-dollar deal with Weather Tech as Laguna Seca's naming rights sponsor that continues to this day.

"The car industry is a tough one for women," said Gill, "Men have dominated the industry since the beginning."

Gill said the industry is slowly changing. Now thousands of women are in the industry working in various jobs from marketing and management to electrical engineering and design. As an example, more than fifty percent of McClaren's workforce are now women. In Formula One racing, many of the engineers, tire changers and pit crew are now made up of women.

Women In Motorsports of North America is a community of professionals devoted to supporting opportunities for women across all disciplines of motorsport by creating an inclusive, resourceful environment to foster membership, advocacy, education and growth, thereby ensuring the continued strength and successful future of our sport.

Gill came for the job at Laguna Seca but has stayed on and still lives in Monterey County. She is currently Director of Business Development for AERO Marketing Group.

Many thanks to **Gill** for her presentation to the Pebble Beach Sports Car Club membership, for **Kathy Hayworth** for bringing **Gill** to the Monterey Peninsula and to **Mike Hayworth**, PBSCC board member who brought **Gill** to our meeting last month.

The Gasline: A Bit of History

As most of you know, PBSCC was founded by five men who sat around one day in 1952 and decided to start the Pebble Beach Sports Car Club. Sometime in the early years the very first newsletter was produced and mailed out. It was called The Gasline and still holds this title to this very day.

According to **Mary Pozzi**, returning club member and dedicated lifelong local car enthusiast, The Gasline was produced years before the transformation of computers entered our world. This means The Gasline was totally produced by hand by a group of very dedicated club volunteers. In the late 1970's it was mimeographed. In later years, it was still hand produced but now it was copied on a copy machine. "It was a labor of love," said **Mary** "We'd all meet at someone's home the fourth Friday of every month for newsletter production and potluck."

Stories submitted by other members were retyped that night as well as each page of the newsletter. It was then proofread, edited, copied (first by mimeograph and later years on a copier), stapled, folded, stamped and mailed in the same night to all 150 members. Once completed then everyone would enjoy their potluck, sometimes not until the wee hours of the next day.

Many people have been part of the newsletter production process over the seven plus decades PBSCC has been in existence. In addition to **Mary Pozzi**, her husband **David** also was a key part of the monthly marathon to get out the newsletter to everyone.

Other key newsletter writers, editors and production crews included Sandi and Larry Miller, Kathy and Warren Pierce, and many others.

New editor **Vicky Kellogg** was given several boxes of very old newsletters. Many are so old the mimeographing has faded so much they are, unfortunately unreadable. However, the goal is to eventually organize them so they can be easily reviewed in chronological order, if possible.

"These old newsletters, legible or not, are a large part of our club's history and should be preserved and protected," said new Gasline editor, **Vicky Kellogg**.


